GRE and TOEFL Updates

Updated GRE coming September 22

Updated TOEFL coming July 26



GRE Test Changes

- Changes to the test include:
 - Removal of the “Analyze an Argument” task in the Analytical Writing section
 - Reduced questions in Verbal and Quantitative Reasoning Sections
 - Removal of the unscored section
 - Removal of 10-minute break
- The score scales remain the same allowing programs to easily compare performance across cohorts before and after September 2023

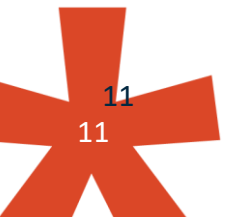


