 - "The trophy would not fit in the bag because <u>it</u> wasn't the right size." What does the word "it" refer to?
 - "I went to the hospital, and <u>they</u> told me to go home and rest." What does the word "they" refer to?

The trophy would not fit in the bag because it wasn't the right size. In the previous sentence, what does the word "it" refer to? Explain your answer. Offer an alternative rationale.

In the sentence "The trophy would not fit in the bag because it wasn't the right size", the pronoun "it" likely refers to "the bag." The reason for this interpretation is based on the syntax and semantics of the sentence. The phrase "wasn't the right size" usually implies an issue with a container or a space (in this case, the bag) not being big enough to accommodate an object (in this case, the trophy).

In the sentence "I went to the hospital, and they told me to go home and rest", the pronoun "they" likely refers to the hospital staff, which may include doctors, nurses, or other medical professionals.

This interpretation is based on the context provided by the sentence. When someone visits a hospital, interactions typically occur with medical personnel. Therefore, in this context, "they" would be interpreted as the people at the hospital responsible for patient care and giving medical advice.

It's worth noting that the precise roles of the individuals (whether they were doctors, nurses, etc.) are not specified by the pronoun "they". It's a general reference to the group of individuals at the hospital who would be involved in examining a patient and providing medical advice or treatment.



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I left five shirts out to dry on a clothesline in the sun. It took them 5 hours to dry. How long would take to dry 30 shirts?

If the amount of time it takes for shirts to dry is simply dependent on exposure to the sun, then it doesn't matter how many shirts you have, they should all dry in the same amount of time, assuming they all have equal exposure to the sun. Therefore, if it takes 5 hours for 5 shirts to dry, it should also take 5 hours for 30 shirts to dry, as long as they are spread out and have the same access to the sun.

This is under the assumption that the drying rate is not impacted by the amount of humidity the clothes are collectively producing as they dry, or any other factors that could change with the scale of the operation.

This might not be the case in a situation where the shirts are too close together and blocking the sun or airflow from each other, in which case it might take longer. But with equal exposure, the number of shirts should not matter.

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The passage says, "It doesn't matter in what order the letters in a word are, the only important thing is that the first and last letter be at the right place. The rest can be a total mess and you can still read it without problem. This is because the human mind does not read every letter by itself, but the word as a whole." This statement illustrates a phenomenon where scrambled words are still readable as long as the first and last letters are in the correct place.
